

ENGLAND'S DRINK BILL.

Pounds Sterling Yearly Since the Year 1800.

In 1899 the gallons of British spirits consumed in England were 35, 357 works of which we have been speaking 770,251, and of colonial spirits 8,588, 781, a total of 44,459,032 gallons. Of beer the barrels consumed were 36, and of other liquors 15,000,000. The expenditure on spirits was £46,196, 778, on beer, £99,4/0,908, on wine £14,995,778, and on other liquors £1.500,000, making an aggregate expenditure of £162,163,474 As compared with the expenditure in 1898 this would give an increase of £7. 682, 510, but as the official return for beer in 1898 was defective to the extent of 560,402 barrels, costing £1.-513.085, this amount should be added to the expenditure in 1898, raising it from £154,480,984 to £155,994,010. The increased expenditure in 1899 was therefore £6,169,455. The total drink expenditure in 1899 was equal to £3 138. 111/d. per head, or for each family of five persons £19 19s.

916d. The expenditure of drink per head has greatly varied during the queen's reign, but nothing is more certain than that temperance reform has exerted a powerfully restraining influence upon the tendency to increased drinking. There has been a largely increased outlay by all classes on articles of wear and consumption, and but for the movement against alcobolics, their use, and the consequent expenditure upon them, would have been augmented in all probability 100 or even 200 per cent.

How a different expenditure might have blessed and enriched the nation must be left for each one to consider. A very large sum must be added to these nine thousand millions as the economic loss in the support of drunkards, paupers, criminals, etc., and in the maintainance of institutions that would not have been required in a sober country.

The consumption of intoxicating drinks, and the expenditure upon them. is not co-equal in the three countries composing the United Kingdom. In 1899 the expenditure in England was sion on the licensing laws.-Lo £134,982,932. or £4 5s. 14d. per head; in Scotland, £14,318,626, or £3 6s. 11d. per head; in Ireland, £12,861,917, or

£2 16s. 8%d. per head. As alcohol is the intoxicating in-

gredient in wine, beer and spirits, it is interesting to note that the liquors consumed in England contained 79,-782,063 gallons of alcohol, or 2.51 per head; in Scotland, 7.865,585 gallins, or 1.84; in Ireland, 7,257.234, or 1.69 per. head. These make up an aggregate consumption of 94,904,882 gallons of alcohol in the United Kingdom, or 2.34 per head.

In the face of this enormous and increasing consumption of intoxicating liquors, what is to be said, and, above all, what is to be done? If, to parody a well-known incident in British history, any assembly were asked to af-
