First they lost Jenner Techechur due to a fishing accident and then not so long ago they lost one of their best ever lifters Valerie Pedro due to dehydration. Valerie won gold in the snatch in the 69kg category in Palau during the 2005 Mini South Pacific Games and she was a regular team member of the Palau weightlifting team. She represented Palau at the 2000 Olympics competing in the 69kg placed 14th overall. Both members will be sadly missed by all who knew them. Our sympathies go to their respective families.
