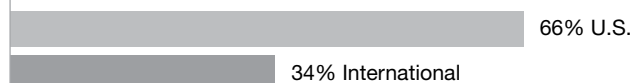

HISTORY

Founded by industrialist and philanthropist **Andrew Carnegie** in 1900, CMU began as the Carnegie Technical Schools in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. In 1912, the school became the Carnegie Institute of Technology, highly regarded for both the arts and technology. A merger with the Mellon Institute — the nation's first major research institute — created Carnegie Mellon University in 1967. **Today, CMU is the youngest of the top 25 universities in the U.S.**
