

These difficulties were ironed out amicably and to everyone's satisfaction.

The United States scored an unprecedented triumph by winning the Olympic Championship in every event on the program.

Detailed results of the final Olympic tryouts in this country and the Olympic competition at London are to be found at the conclusion of this report.

Our team also accounted for three new Olympic records, one of them a world mark in the relay.

Only one accident marred our competition. Miller Anderson, diver, was injured during practice, and upon the recommendation of the team physicians, was withdrawn from the platform event. After a few days' rest, he recovered and resumed diving, accompanying the team on its post-Olympic tour.

One recommendation I wish to make is that future team managers be granted a small petty cash fund to be used for the purchase of needed incidentals, such as food, hot beverages, vitamins and the like, as well as transportation fares when

needed. During the Olympic competition it is difficult at times to transport athletes to and from the stadia for meals which are served at specified times. Transportation problems arise when schedules do not correspond with competitions.

It has been a distinct honor to serve and be associated with this team and the people who made up the U. S. Olympic Committee. It has been a most pleasant experience to have the opportunity to have been part of a world's championship aggregation.

Fred Matthaei and Doug Roby of Detroit sent word to this meeting that they had wired the U.S. Olympic Committee officers directing the money they had donated be earmarked for women's swimming. These gentlemen worked hard and contributed generously to both the men's and women's swimming committees, and were responsible for holding the trials in Detroit. We are indebted to them for their unselfish efforts and assistance.

On board the *S.S. America*, Coach Daughters had the girls work out on

belts in the water, while Coach Cady had the divers going through necessary exercises to keep them in condition.

In London, we were housed at Southlands College, Wimbledon. The Swimming Team was quartered together on one floor with one or two girls to a room. The rooms were light and airy.

Transportation, while quite a problem in London proper, was not too much a hardship for us, as this item was handled most efficiently, even though we were quite a distance from the pool.

Our big problem was the food situa-

tion. While we realized there were food shortages, even with the auxiliary food from the United States our meals rarely were balanced. Lack of refrigeration caused much food to be unfit for use. It is suggested that there always should be a snack bar where our athletes are quartered. There was one at Uxbridge, where the men were lodged, and it would have helped tremendously to have had one at Southlands.

After our Olympic competition ended, some of the girls were taken to Hol-

WOMEN'S SWIMMING

Report of Committee Chairman and Team Manager

At one of the first meetings of the Women's Swimming Committee, held in 1947 in Seattle, a lengthy discussion was held on the selection of coaches for the team. Choice of a coach for swimming was again discussed at a meeting held in August, 1947, in Chicago, and Ray Daughters was elected as swimming coach. At another committee meeting held in December, 1947, Fred Cady was appointed diving coach for women. Mrs. Whiting was named team chaperon, and the Chairman was elected manager.

The final tryouts were held July 8-11,

1948, in Detroit, together with the men's trials. A former Olympic diving champion, Clarence Pinkston, now of the Detroit A.C., did an outstanding job as director of the meet.

Seventeen women were successful in winning places on the Olympic team. Listed by events, they are:

100-meters freestyle and 400-meters relay—Ann Curtis, University of California; Marie Corridon, Norwalk, Conn.; Brenda Helser, Los Angeles A.C.; Thelma Kalama, Hawaii; Jacqueline LaVine, Chicago; and Mary Patricia Healey, Watchung Lake S.C., N. J.

400-meters freestyle—Miss Curtis; Nancy Merki Lees, Portland, Ore.; and Miss Helser.

100-meters backstroke—Suzanne Zimmerman, Portland, Ore.; Muriel Mellon, Los Angeles; and Barbara Jensen, Oakland, Cal.

200-meters breaststroke—Jeanne Wilson, Chicago; Carol J. Pence, Purdue; and Clara Lamore, Providence, R. I.

Diving—Zoe Ann Olsen, Oakland, Cal.; Mrs. Victoria Manalo Draves, Los Angeles; Patricia Elsener, San Francisco; and Juno Stover, Pasadena, Cal.

In Olympic competition, our team

won four championships in the seven events, together with four second places, one third and two fifth places, for a total of 11 places among the first six finishers in each event.

We boasted one double winner, the only one of the entire U.S. squad—Vicky Draves, who won both the springboard and platform dives. Ann Curtis won the 400-meters freestyle after losing a very close decision in the 100-meters. Miss Curtis was credited with one of the most magnificent performances in all the swimming races when she anchored the U.S. team to an Olympic title in the 400-meters relay, overcoming a seemingly insurmountable lead.

In the final analysis, the United States easily outranked the other nations taking part in women's swimming; Denmark took two of the three remaining titles, and the Netherlands the other.

As is always the case in swimming, we had difficulty financing our team. Lou Wilkie, Chairman of the Olympic Basketball Committee, generously had a sum of money raised by his group earmarked for women's swimming. However, it was necessary to have a meeting of our Committee at Detroit to insure finances to send a full team to London. It was learned that sums had been sent in for our sport, but they had not been earmarked, and this was done.
