


# Major Impacted Sectors during Pandemic in Iskandar Malaysia

### **Opportunities (Covid-Push)**

- Need for Speed: Decentralize investment approval process to Regional Agencies
- MRO @ Senai (e.g. Relocating from Singapore)

- e.g. Singapore, China, Japan& Korea












# IMBRT will be the backbone of public transportation in Iskandar Malaysia




