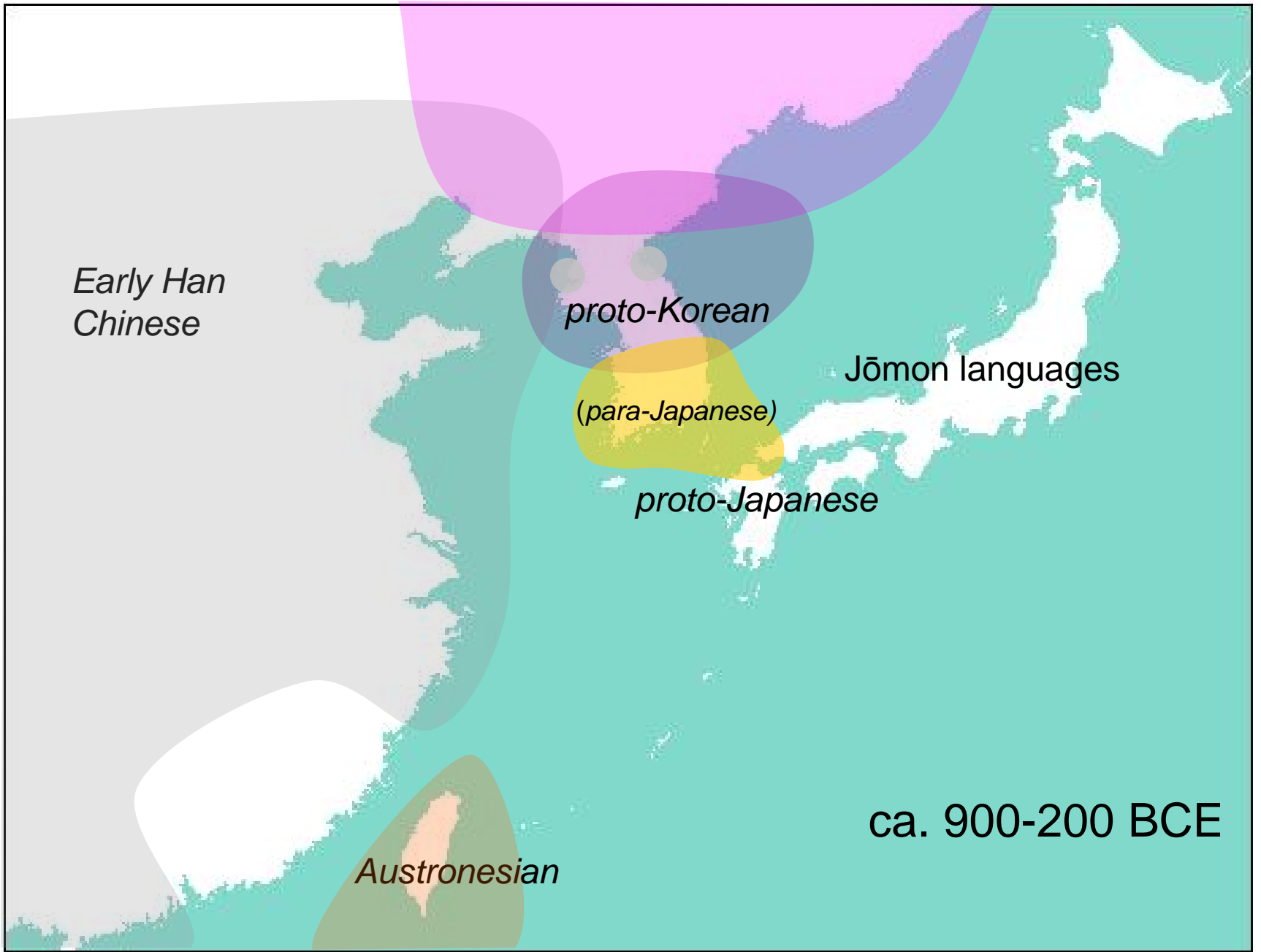

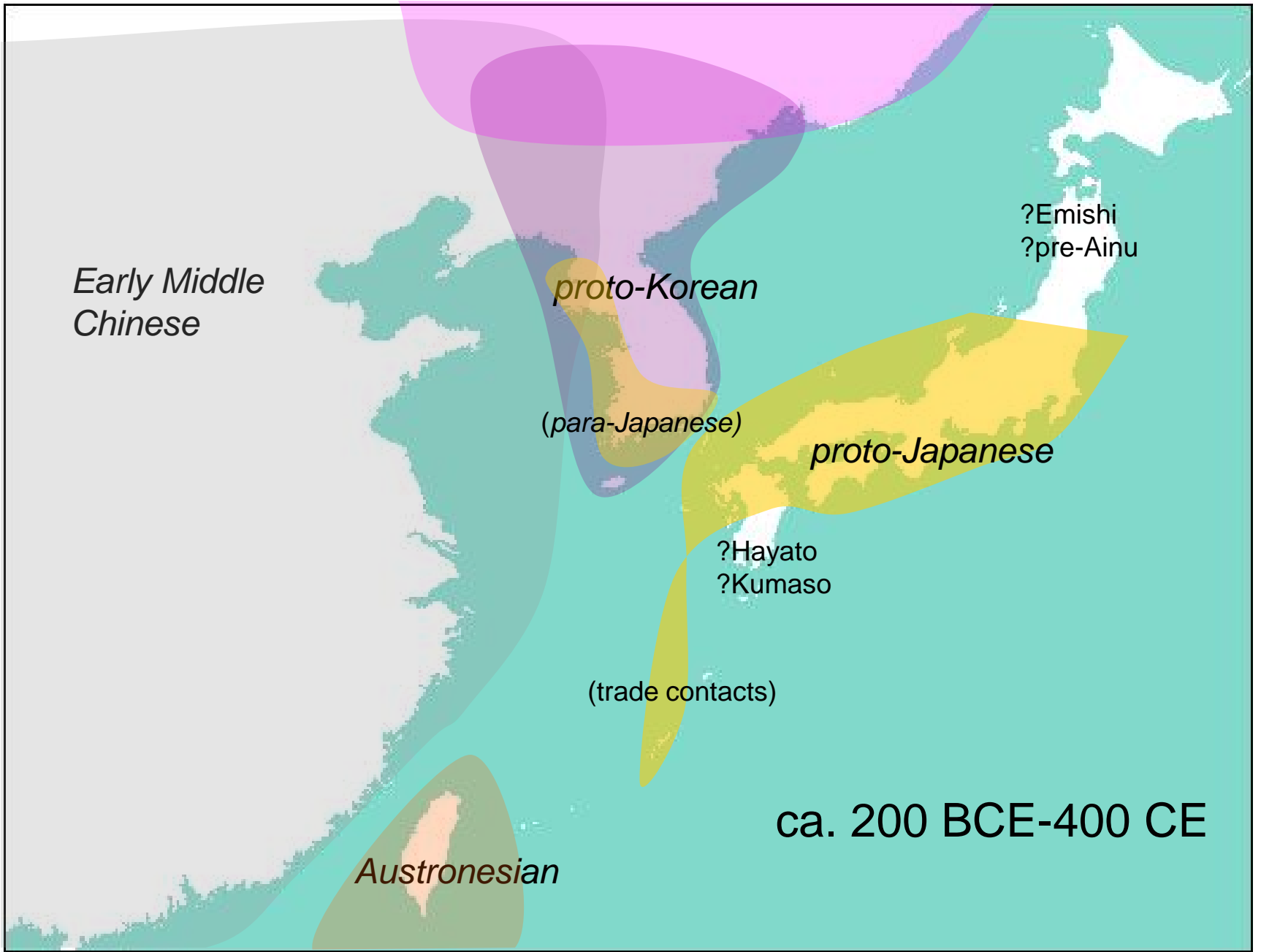

A. Synonyms of OJ words with para-Japanese cognates

1. K *sey* < MK *se(k)* ~ *sey(h)* ‘three’ < OK **sagi* →
OJ *saki(kusa)* id. > J *saigusa* 三枝 (*ateji*) ≠ OJ *mi* id.
2. MK *cas* ‘fortress’ < OK **casi* → OJ *sasi* id. ≠ OJ *siro* id., OJ
kura ‘storehouse’ (*Musasi* 武蔵 (*ateji*) ~ *kura* 蔵)
3. MK *kwol* ‘valley, deep hole’ < OK **kola* →
pre-OJ **kora* > OJ *kura* ‘valley’ ≠ OJ *tani* ‘valley’
4. MK *kyel* ‘wave’ → OJ *kiyori* ‘(epithet)’ ≠ OJ *nami* ‘wave’
5. MK *mel-* ‘far, distant, remote’ →
OJ *mara-* ~ *moro-* ‘far’, *mare* < **maraci* ‘rare’ ≠ OJ *topo* ‘far’
6. K *kiph-* ‘deep’ < OK ?**kipha-*, ?**kipa-k-* → OJ *kipa* ‘brink’ ≠
OJ *puka-* ‘deep’
7. MK *palol* ‘sea’ < OK **patol* →
OJ *una-para* ~ *una-bara* ‘surface of the ocean’ ≠ OJ *wata* ‘sea’

B. Synonyms of OJ words with Korean cognates

1. K *kkun* ‘cord’ < MK *kinh* ~ *skin* < OK *ski- → OJ *suki* ‘baby-carrying sling’ ≠ wo ‘cord’ < pKJ *bə
2. MK *syem* < OK *syema ‘limited territory; island’ → OJ *sema* ≠ OJ *sima* id. < pKJ *syema
3. K *kokwulye* ‘Koguryō’ < OK *kwulye → OJ *kure* id. ≠ EMJ (*kau*)*kuri* id. < pJ *kure < pKJ *kwulye
4. MK *kuluh* ‘stump (tree counter)’ ?< OK *kudye* → EMJ *kure* ‘board, measured piece of wood’ ≠ OJ *kwi* ~ *ko-* ‘tree; wood’ < pJ *kəi < *kədi < pKJ *kədye

C. Synonyms of other OJ words

1. MK *kye`zulh* ‘winter’ → OJ *kisaragi* ‘second lunar month’ ≠ OJ *puyu* ‘winter’
2. MK *pal* ‘leg, foot’ < OK *palk → OJ *pagi* ‘shin’ ≠ J *asi* ‘leg, foot’
3. MK *twolh* ‘stone’ < *two`kol → OJ *toko(name)* ‘stone slime’ ≠ OJ *isi* ‘stone’, *ipa* ‘rock, crag’
4. K *cina-* ‘pass through, pass over’ → OJ *sina-* ‘slope’ ≠ OJ *saka* id.
5. MK *sal* ‘arrow’ → OJ *sa ~ sati ~ satu-* ‘arrow, spear’ ≠ J *ya* ‘arrow’
6. MK *mosi* ‘(plant)’ → OJ (*kara*)*musi* id. ≠ OJ *wo* ‘hemp’
7. MK *ilang* ‘ridge between furrows’ < OK *ilang → OJ *iraka* ‘roof tile’ ≠ OJ *une* ‘ridge between furrows’
8. MK *hoy* ‘sun’ < OK *koy → J *ka* in *hatuka* ‘twentieth day’, *ko* in *koyomi* ‘calendar’ ≠ OJ *pi* ‘sun, day’
9. MK *man`ho-* ‘many’ < OK *mane- → OJ ((*s*)*a*)*mane-si* ‘many; widespread’ ≠ OJ *opo* ‘big; many’
10. MK *polk* ‘dawn, shine’ → EMJ (*asa*)*borake* ‘dawn’ ≠ *ake-* ‘get light’
11. K *kaci* ‘branch’ < OK ?*kwac → pre-OJ *kosa > OJ *kusa* id. in *sakikusa* ≠ OJ *ye(da)* id. > J *eda*

D. Innovative loans

1. OJ *potoke* ‘Buddha’ ← **putoke* antecedent of K *puthye*
id. < **pwutV-hV*
2. OJ *kugutu* ‘puppet’ ← the OK form of K *kkoktwu* id. ?<
MCh **kakthuk* 郭秃 ‘puppet’ (displaced later by *kairai* 傀儡
‘puppet’ and *ningyoo* 人形 ‘puppet, doll’)
3. EMJ *sozoro* ‘involuntarily’ ~ *suzuro* ← K *susulo* ‘on
one’s own’ ~ *susalo* < MK *suso-lwo*
