Here are two examples of the character, from the 16th and 20th centuries. The first is from the Primer printed by Ivan Fedorov (L'viv, 1574), the last letter of the seventh line of the alphabet, and the second from a modern edition of the Acts of the Apostles (the penultimate word of the first line).
